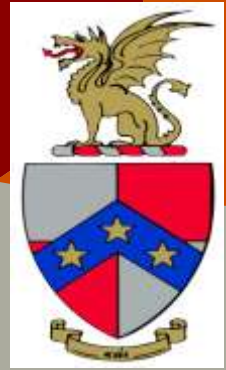

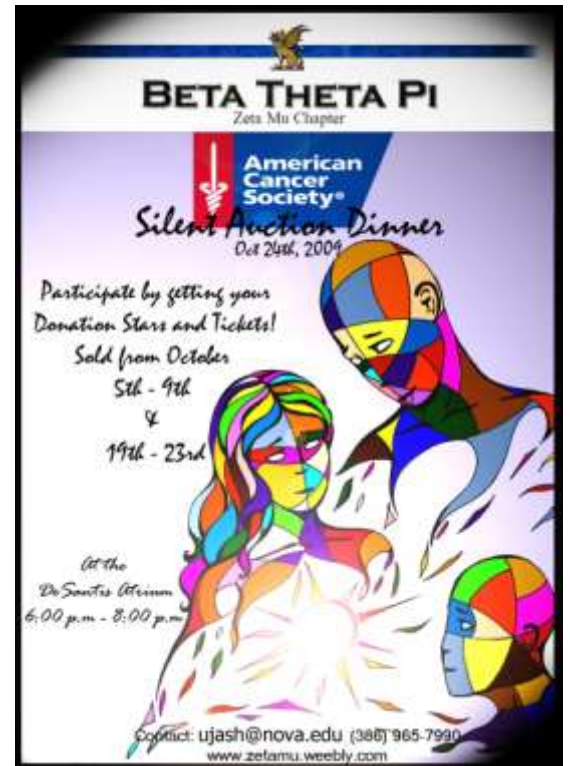
## Promoting hope: The American Cancer Society & Beta's Silent Dinner Auction

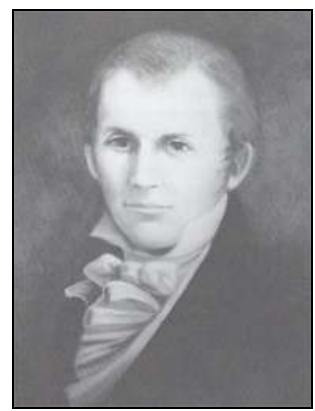

## THE FOUNDER'S CORNER: JOHN REILY KNOX



**John Reily Knox** was an American attorney who was the principal founder of Beta Theta Pi Fraternity at Miami University in 1839. He was born on a farm between Millville, Ohio and Venice, Ohio and graduated from Miami University "first rank in his class" and president of the Union Literary Society. In Beta Theta Pi, he is known as "Pater" in acknowledgment of his role in the origin and design of the fraternity. He taught school in Mississippi, and was admitted to the bar and practiced at Greenville, Ohio, Dayton, Ohio, and Greenville.
